The Commission is aware that no solution exists to the problem of delivering 21st-century care in 19th or 20th-century physical environments with antiquated systems of communication and cooperation extant when the NHS was founded. Moreover, the endless use of health services as a political football, challenges to mutually acceptable and agreed changes to the delivery of care by the Competition Commission,⁷ the courts, or politicians⁸ should not stand in the way of this change. As the Mid Staffordshire scandal has shown, history does not deal kindly with those who shirk their responsibilities in this regard. It is time for the Royal College of Physicians and its members and fellows to show the way.
